Volunteer hours - Students must complete more than 40 hours of Ontario community service

## Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

All graduates from Ontario high schools must take the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test. The test is held once every year.

## What do you need to graduate from high school?

### 18 compulsory credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

4	credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
3	credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
2	credits in science
1	credit in Canadian history
1	credit in Canadian geography
1	credit in the arts
1	credit in health and physical education
1	credit in French as a second language
0.5	credit in career studies
0.5	credit in civics

In addition, students must complete:

✓	12 optional credits <sup>†</sup>
✓	40 hours of community involvement activities
✓	the provincial literacy requirement

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

\* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

\*\* In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

\*\*\* A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

<sup>†</sup> The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.



# Why Ontario Education?

**Ontario Secondary School Education contributes to Canada's overall rankings of 7th in the world.**

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma is recognized all around the world - North America, Europe, Australia, the UK, etc.
- Students holding OSSD gets priority admission into Ontario Universities through OUAC 101 and 105.
- Students holding OSSD gets priority scholarships upon admission.

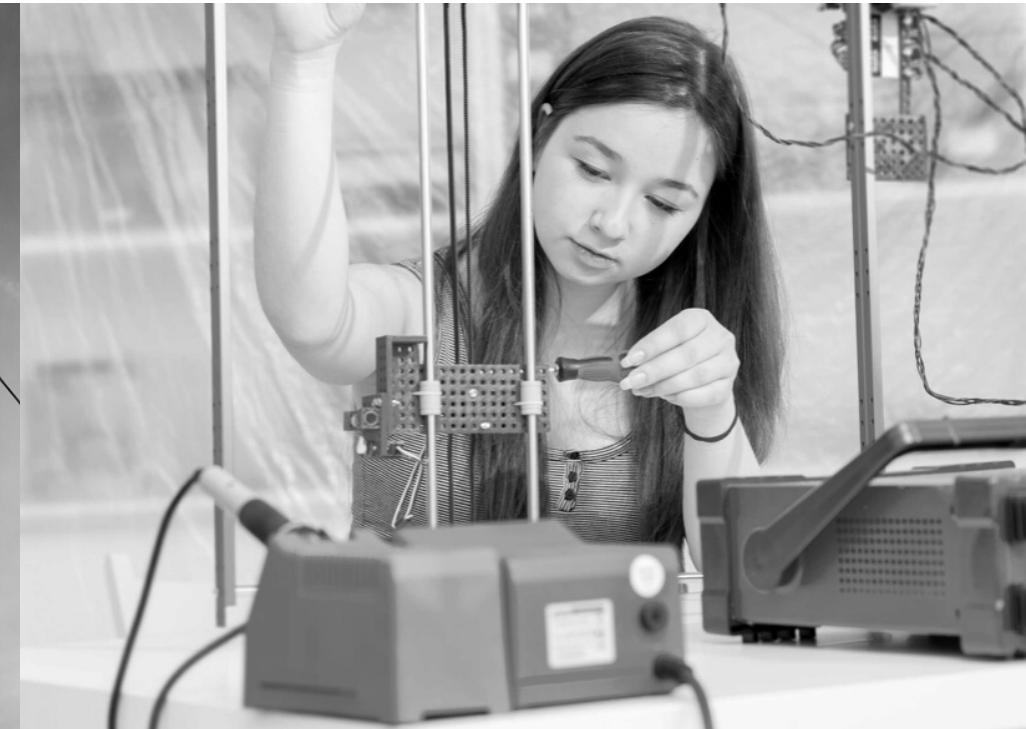
